Not every divorce has to be messy. Alan Freed works to resolve family law issues through creative, non-adversarial problem-solving.

Freed's practice focuses on mediation and collaborative divorce. He's been a mediator since 1985 and is routinely listed among the best in the nation in family law matters.

Freed helped to found the Collaborative Family Law Association in 2002 and served as the organization's president in 2009. He also served as a board member and president of Kids In the Middle, which helps children whose parents are going through separation and divorce.

Freed is the author of a chapter on mediation in The Missouri Bar's family law deskbook. Along with law partner Alisse Camazine, he co-authored "Divorce in Missouri," a comprehensive guide on state divorce issues for non-lawyers.

Freed earned his law degree in 1983 from Washington University in St. Louis, where he taught for years as an adjunct professor.

Freed is also his firm's primary appellate attorney. He routinely appears in the Court of Appeals and the Missouri Supreme Court on complex issues of custody and maintenance.
